REPORTING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE

Whether it's an illness, a medical appointment or other important event, there are times when students may need to be away from school. Using the Safe Arrival system, parents can report daily absences, and even schedule absences in one of three ways:

1. Call toll-free before the bell time: 1-866-606-5567.
2. Log on to the Board Portal at <https://dsbn.org/safearrival/> Using this website, you can set up your account to report and schedule absences.
3. Using your smart phone or tablet. Simply download the SchoolMessenger app. The app is compatible with both Apple and Android devices.
